Your Mission: Dive deeper into Britannica to solve complex challenges.




Challenge 1: From the Children home page, use the search bar to look for volcano and select the first article, volcano (geology). Where is the world's largest active volcano?


Level 4: Time Traveler

Challenge 2: From the Biographies section, select the letter D and open the article on Roald Dahl. Click the photograph to enlarge it, and then select More Tools at the top. Find and write down the citation for the image at the bottom. Hint: Look for the italics!





Bonus Challenge: Return to the article on Roald Dahl and read about his life.

- 1. What sad event happened to him when he was just 3 years old?
- 2. How might this have influenced the kinds of stories he wrote as an author?

Teacher Implementation Guide

Preparing for the scavenger hunt:

- 1. Distribute a print or digital copy of the Britannica Library Scavenger Hunt and a Scavenger Hunt Collector's Card to each student, pair, or group, depending on your preference.
- 2. Cut out the badges provided on pages 8-9.
- 3. Make enough badge copies for each student to receive one per level.

During the scavenger hunt:

- After each level is completed, check students' answers using the Teacher Answer Key on page 7.
- 2. Have students correct any incorrect answers.
- 3. Once all answers are correct, give students their level badge.
- 4. Students will paste their badges onto their Scavenger Hunt Collector's Cards.

Post scavenger hunt—celebrating success:

Consider the following display and celebration suggestions to recognize students' achievements, foster peer learning, and create lasting memories of their research journey through the Britannica Library Scavenger Hunt.

- Create a Badge Masters Wall in your classroom to showcase completed Scavenger Hunt Collector's Cards.
- Take photos of students with their completed cards to share on your class website or newsletter.
- Host a brief Badge Ceremony where students can present their favorite discoveries from the hunt.
- Have students partner up to share what they learned and which level they found most interesting.
- Create a class bulletin board titled "Our Britannica Adventure" featuring the completed cards and student reflections.

Extension Activities: These optional activities extend student learning beyond the scavenger hunt, allowing them to demonstrate their understanding through creative projects, reflection, data analysis, and review opportunities.

- Invite students to create their own scavenger hunt questions based on what they learned.
- Have students write a brief reflection about their favorite discoveries.
- Create a class graph showing which badge levels students found most challenging or interesting.
- Use completed Scavenger Hunt Collector's Cards as review material for future lessons.


